MUNICH – A MODERN CITY WITH TRADITION

The history of Munich is documented all the way back to 1158 when it was first mentioned as “forum apud Munichen”. The Old German name means “by the monks” and derives from the monks who ran a monastery at the place that was to become the Old Town of Munich. A monk is still depicted on the city’s coat of arms.

Today, the Bavarian state capital is the third-largest city in Germany – behind Berlin and Hamburg – and one of the most prosperous and fastest-growing cities in the country. It is consistently voted one of Germany’s most liveable cities, with various career opportunities, a low crime rate, a broad selection of leisure and recreational activities plus an efficient infrastructure ensuring a high quality of life.

A METROPOLIS WITH SMALL-TOWN CHARM

Munich has become a global household name in various sectors, be it art, science, technology, education, or sports. The city houses many world-known brands, such as BMW, Siemens, Allianz, or FC Bayern Munich. There is

a broad range of culture to be found in the 47 theatres and 46 museums, including the renowned Pinakotheken and the world’s largest technology museum, Deutsches Museum.

Till this day no building is allowed to be taller than the spires of the Frauenkirche (Cathedral Church of Our Lady), which unknowingly ensures that Munich does not feel as overwhelming as other cities of its scale. Various other factors add to the cosy vibe, from the city’s parks to Bavaria’s southern charm and famed beer culture.

While the Oktoberfest nowadays often pictures a cliché, it is deeply rooted in tradition. When Crown Prince Ludwig married Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen in 1810, the citizens of Munich were invited to attend the festivities held in front of the city’s gates, with horse races marking the close of the royal event. To honour their marriage the first Oktoberfest was held the following year and it has grown to what we see now over the centuries.

GATEWAY TO THE ALPS

Besides its touristic attractions, Munich boasts numerous green spots, with the English Garden alone covering 375 hectares! The Eisbach wave at its southern edge is probably the most famous river surfing spot and used by surfers throughout the year. With a length of 13.7 kilometres, the Isar winds its way through the city and offers additional recreational activities on its banks.

With its central European location and proximity to the Alps, Munich is the perfect destination for both city and nature lovers. The picturesque lakes and mountains are just a short drive away and provide the perfect setting for a weekend getaway.

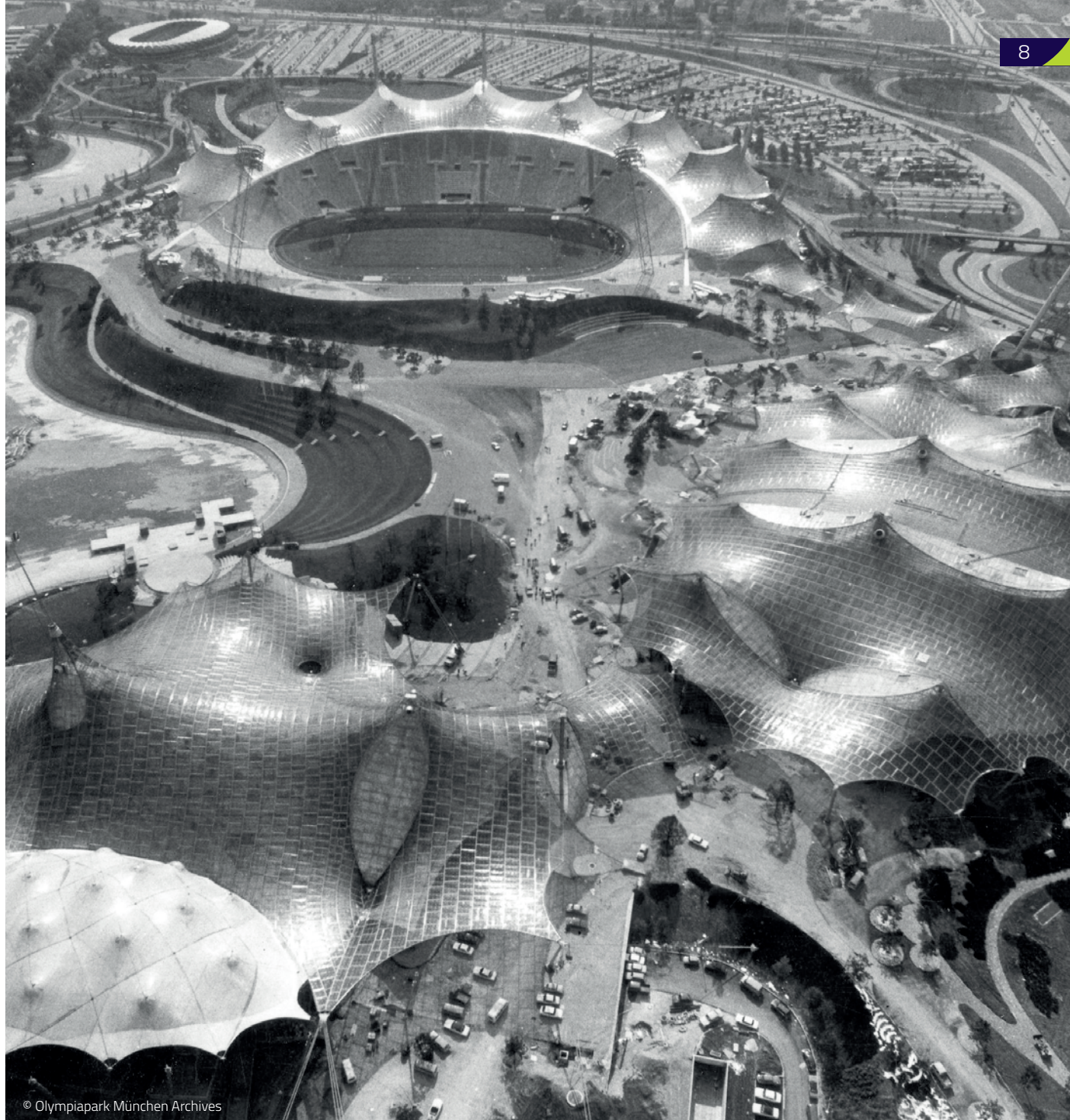


BACK TO THE ROOFS

Olympiapark München is an event location and meeting point with a glorious past, a vibrant present and a bright future. In August 2022, the park will once again be in the spotlight: By hosting the European Championships Munich 2022, Munich will welcome the largest sporting event since the 1972 Summer Olympics. High-profile sports 'under one roof', right in the heart of the city, in a carefree atmosphere – such is the winning formula for a unique and memorable experience. Back then, just as it is today.

Munich 2022 is an innovative return to the roots of the 1972 Olympic Games. A reminiscence of hospitality, happiness, and community, but also of the victims of the attack on the Israeli Olympic team. At the same time, the event is a return to a unique and historic place. It is a return to the legendary architecture of Olympiapark with its world-famous tent roof construction, which once turned Munich, seen as a village housing a million people, into an international sports metropolis overnight.

Munich 2022 pays homage to this heritage, celebrates the uniqueness of Munich as a venue, sets an example in terms of sustainability and leaves its own legacy. This is another, but certainly not the last chapter in the success story of Olympiapark.

With the historic Olympic locations at the forefront, the European Championships 2022 will primarily use pre-existing infrastructure and venues, setting an example in terms of sustainability. Short commutes between the venues and excellent public transport will further minimise the impact on the city and its surroundings.

The Munich Olympic Regatta Centre will be one of the venues in the spotlight, as it will serve as a backdrop to both, Europe’s canoe sprint and rowing elites. Located just eight kilometres from Olympiapark, competitors and fans will be able to revel in the same atmosphere as those attending the other competitions in and around the city. Having hosted the 1972 Olympics, the centre will welcome back international canoe sprint competition, with the ECA Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe European Championships taking place in Munich for a first time.

AN ALL-NEW EXPERIENCE IN MUNICH

It will be a premiere for the Munich Olympic Regatta Centre, as the celebrated venue is set to host its maiden ECA Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe European Championships in 2022. Originally built for the 1972 Olympic Games, the centre has organised a multitude of regattas. It is meeting current technological standards and is offering world-class conditions, whilst maintaining its Olympic legacy.

The European standard course features nine lanes at a length of 1,000 metres. Built parallel to the prevailing southwest and northeast winds, the course can be used even in difficult weather conditions, ensuring a fair competition for all athletes. Located eight kilometres north of Olympiapark, the centre provides ample space for the championships' required infrastructure, while still being close to the city.

AN EXAMPLE OF SUSTAINABILITY

A special effort was made to fit the architecture harmoniously into the landscape of Dachauer Moos – today an extensive nature reserve – and it paid off. The canoe sprint and rowing events at the Olympic Games were a resounding success beyond sporting results, with the centre's architect, Michael Eberl, receiving the Grand Prize of the Association of German Architects in 1973. The creators chose a location and envisioned a facility that would serve a purpose far beyond its Olympic usage.

The Regatta Centre has proven its worth on multiple occasions and has become a popular leisure spot for locals and visitors alike. From cycling and inline skating to beach volleyball and swimming, the venue is suited for various activities, whilst remaining one of the most

renowned training and competition facilities for canoe sprint and rowing.

BACK TO THE ROOFS

Over the past decades, the centre has been one of the busiest regatta venues worldwide, playing host to a plethora of national and international events. Canoe sprint fans have been treated to Germany's best kayakers and canoeists fighting for glory at a total of 12 German Championships. And with the ECA Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe European Championships they will now get to enjoy the first major international event in 50 years. An Olympic location set in idyllic wilderness that promises perfect event presentation for athletes and spectators: what proved successful in 1972 is still an excellent mix today.

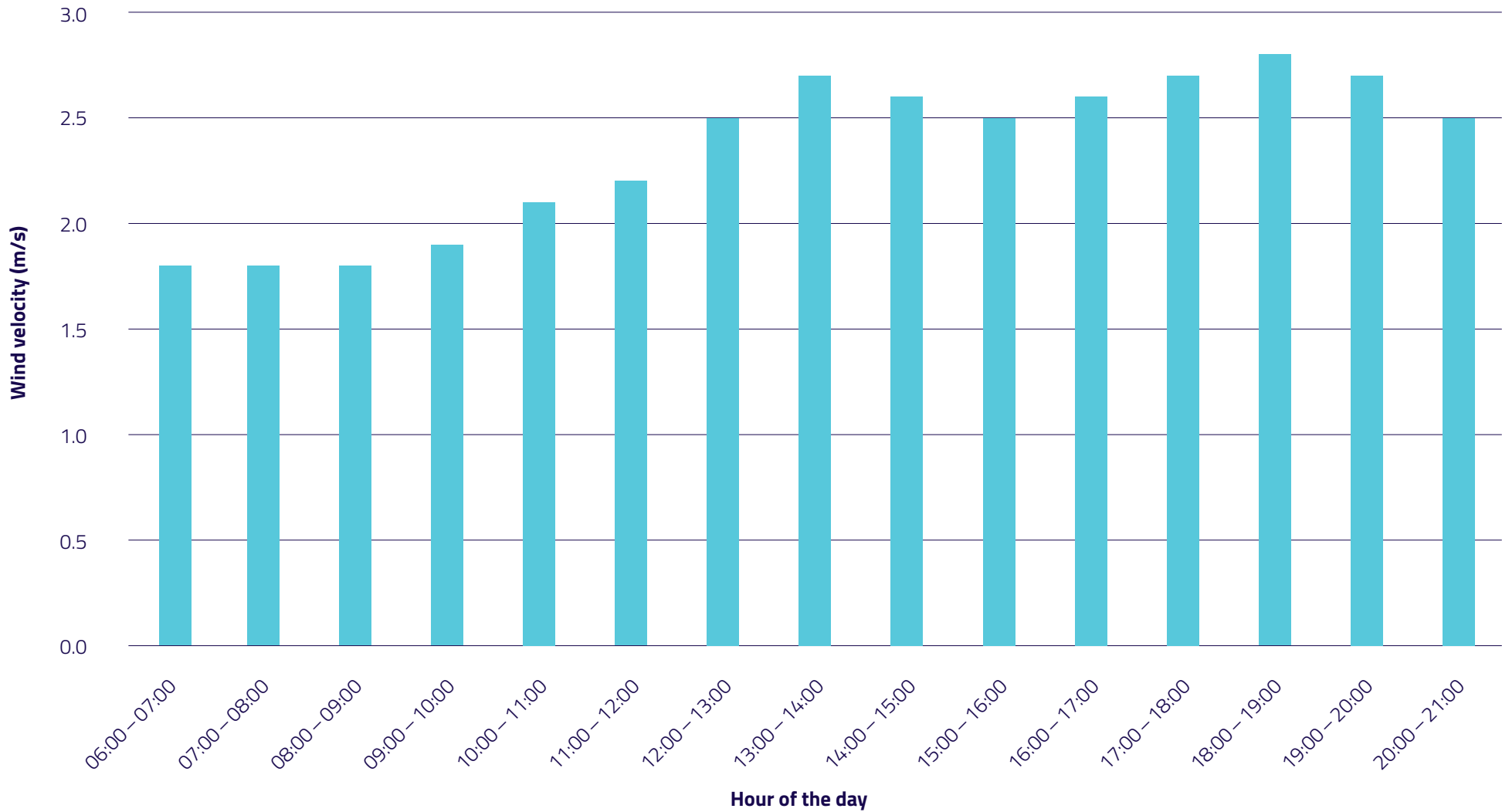

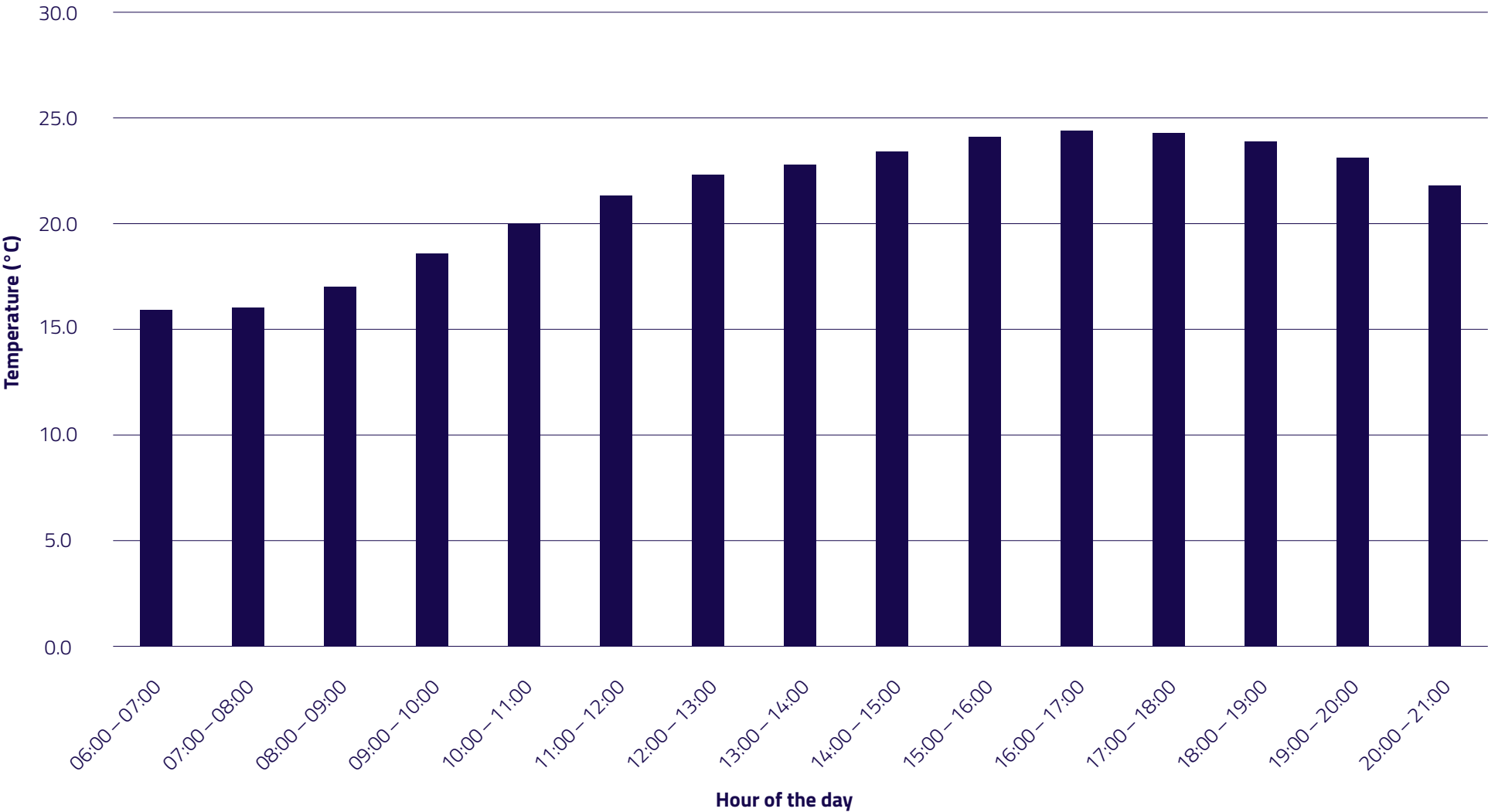
WIND

AVERAGE OVER PERIOD 15 – 21 AUG (2015 – 2020)



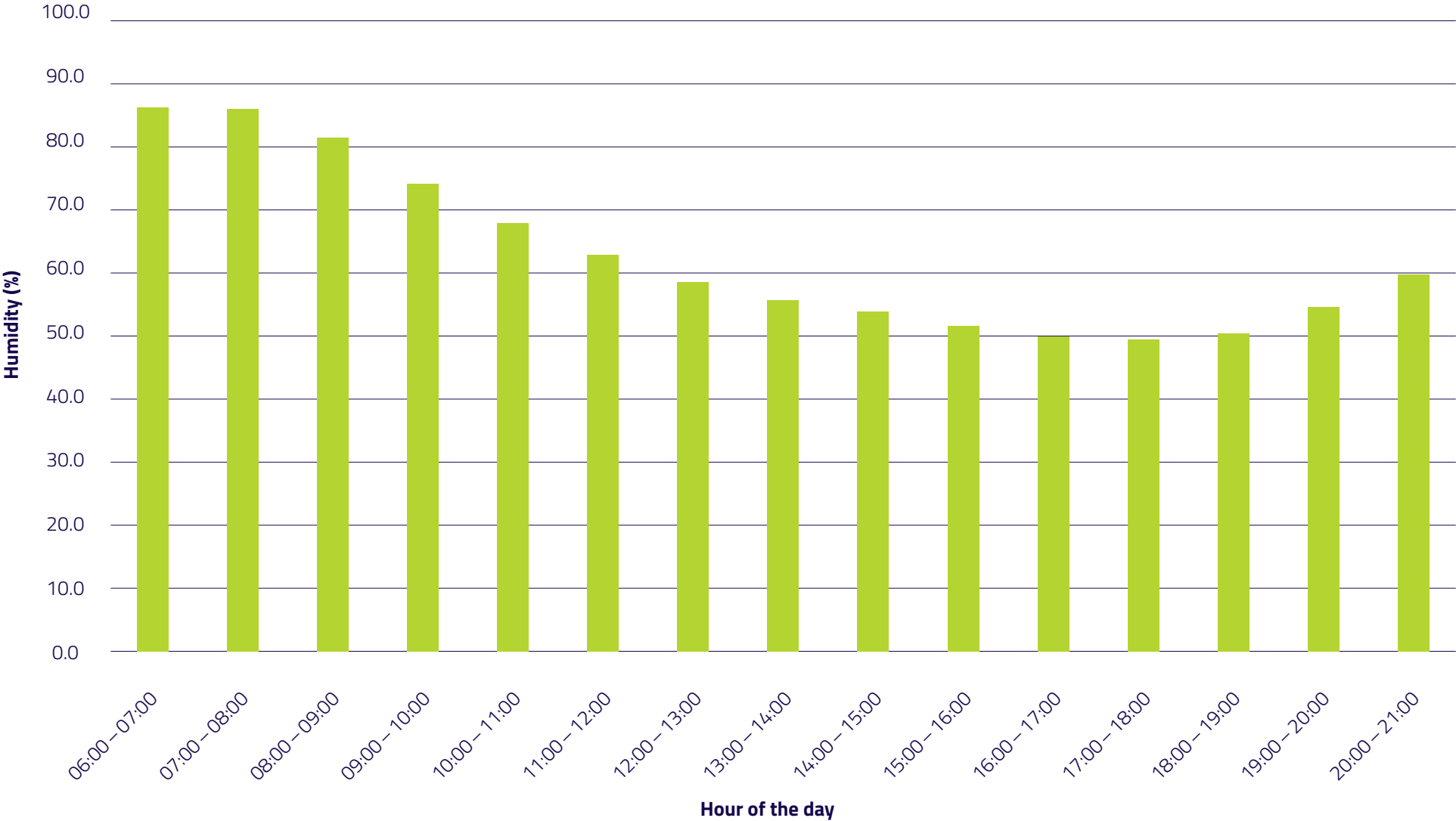
TEMPERATURE

AVERAGE OVER PERIOD 15 – 21 AUG (2015 – 2020)



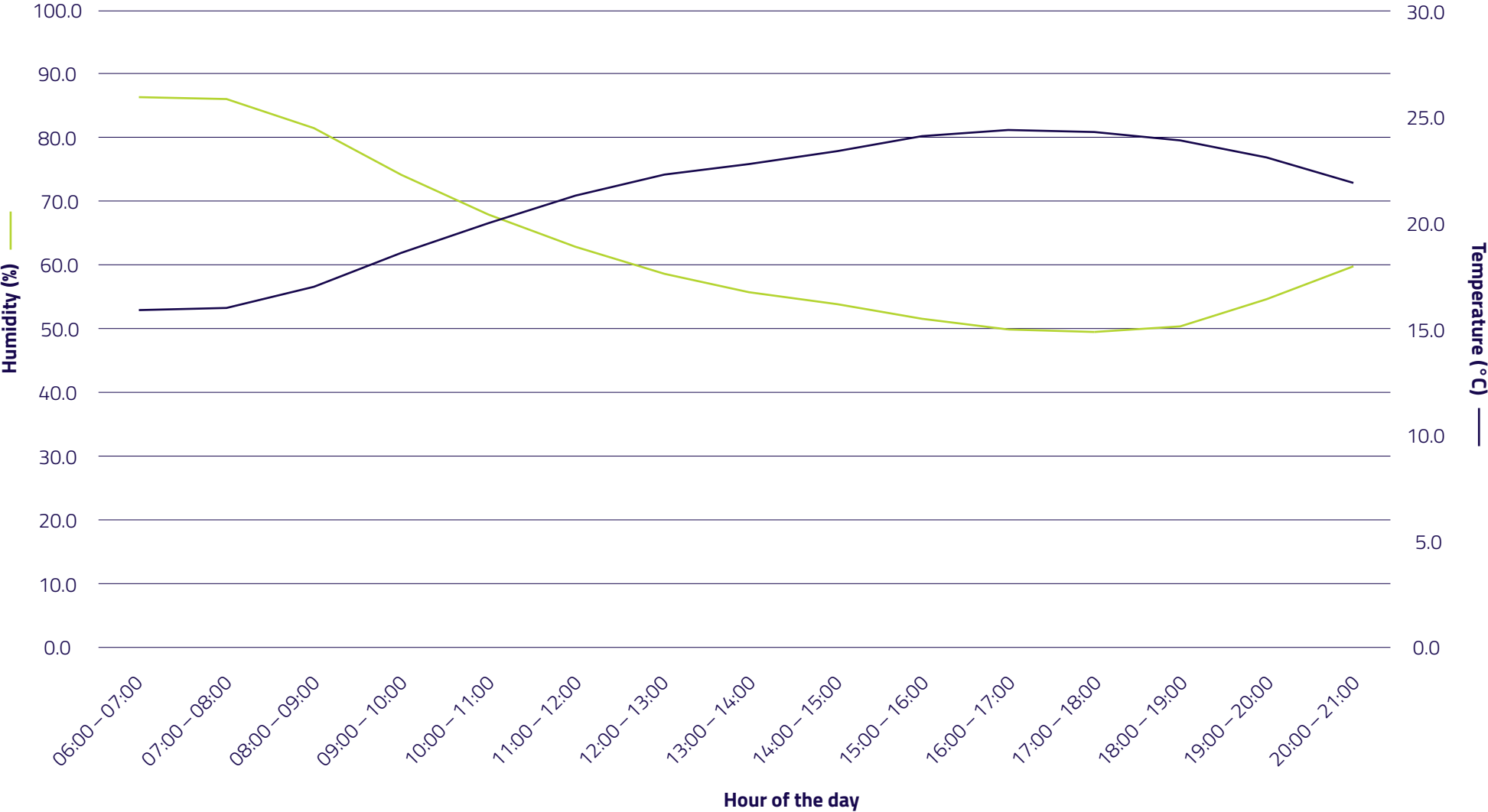
HUMIDITY

COMPETITION INFORMATION

The Munich Olympic Regatta Centre officially opens on Tuesday, 16 August 2022. Racing at the 2022 ECA Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe European Championships will officially begin on Thursday, 18 August 2022. The competition schedule will be set by the European Canoe Association upon consultation with European Championships Management Sàrl (ECM) and the LOC and will be published on the websites canoe-europe.org and munich2022.com.

BOAT TRAILERS AND TEAM PARKING

Boat trailers only can be parked directly on the venue in the dedicated trailer area behind the boat hangars. For other team vehicles, there is a dedicated team parking area free of charge adjacent to the venue with direct access to the boat storage area. The number of vehicles per team will be limited. Additional parking possibilities for additional team and private cars will be offered outside of the venue.

PLEASE NOTE:

The Local Organising Committee (LOC) will send a comprehensive and detailed list of hotel proposals to all Member Federations. Teams are encouraged to make bookings via the European Championships Event Management System (EMS) or to report to the LOC in case they have made their own arrangements.

Due to the impact of the Covid-19 situation, slight changes regarding hotel options, booking conditions and room rates are still possible.

¹ 11 rooms are fully equipped as accessible rooms and 69 rooms are defined as barrier free rooms.

² Rates for double rooms include a double occupancy. Single room rates apply for single occupancy.

³ All prices are incl. VAT. Full Board includes breakfast & dinner at the hotel and lunch at the venue.

All Services include airport and shuttle transportation. Please note that a twin room is a room with two separate beds. A double room is a room with one bed.

ACCOMMODATION FOR PARA-ATHLETES

The hotels can offer a total of eleven rooms that are officially labelled as accessible rooms. These include all prescribed handles and wheelchair accessibility. Additionally, the hotels can offer 69 barrier free rooms that also allow wheelchair access but do not have handholds and the specified distances. The features of the barrier free rooms differ slightly depending on the hotel. Therefore, please provide information on any specific needs of para-athletes during the booking process. This will assist the LOC to find the most suitable accommodation for the athletes.

BOOKING PROCEDURE FOR TEAMS

Teams can make their hotel bookings via the European Championships Event Management System (EMS). The accommodation portal will open in Q1/2022 and the teams will be provided with a link to enter the booking platform.

Accommodation should be booked as soon as possible to ensure a timely reservation. Accommodation is provided on a "first come first served basis". Once the online booking process has been completed, an invoice including payment notification is generated and sent by e-mail.

CANCELLATION POLICY FOR TEAMS

► Until 01 May 2022

For any cancellation made until that date – no cancellation fee will be charged

► Until 01 June 2022

20% of the booked rooms per night can be cancelled free of charge

► Until 01 July 2022

10% of the booked rooms per night can be cancelled free of charge

► After 01 July 2022

Cancellations made after that date – 100% of the total accommodation cost incl. meals will be charged – no refundable cancellation will be possible.

For any cancellations made until 01 May 2022, no cancellation fee will be charged and 100% of the booked rooms can be cancelled. After this date, only a percentage of rooms can be cancelled free of charge. The rest of the booked rooms cannot be cancelled and must be paid in full.

The accommodation booking will be guaranteed only after receipt of the full payment of the accommodation costs. In case the full payment is not received within the deadlines, the reservation will be cancelled and the rooms released. Cancellations within the applicable deadlines will be refunded.

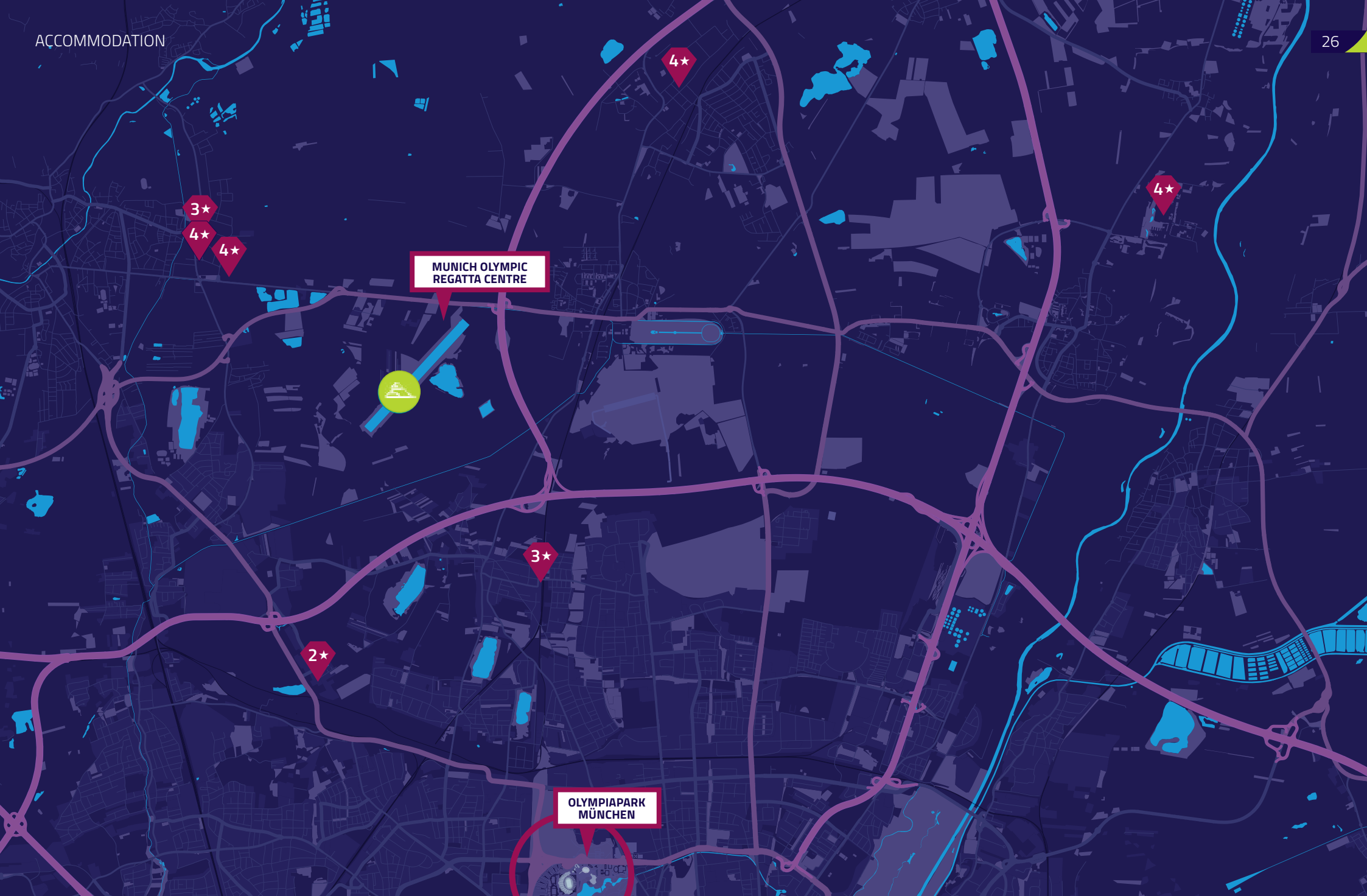

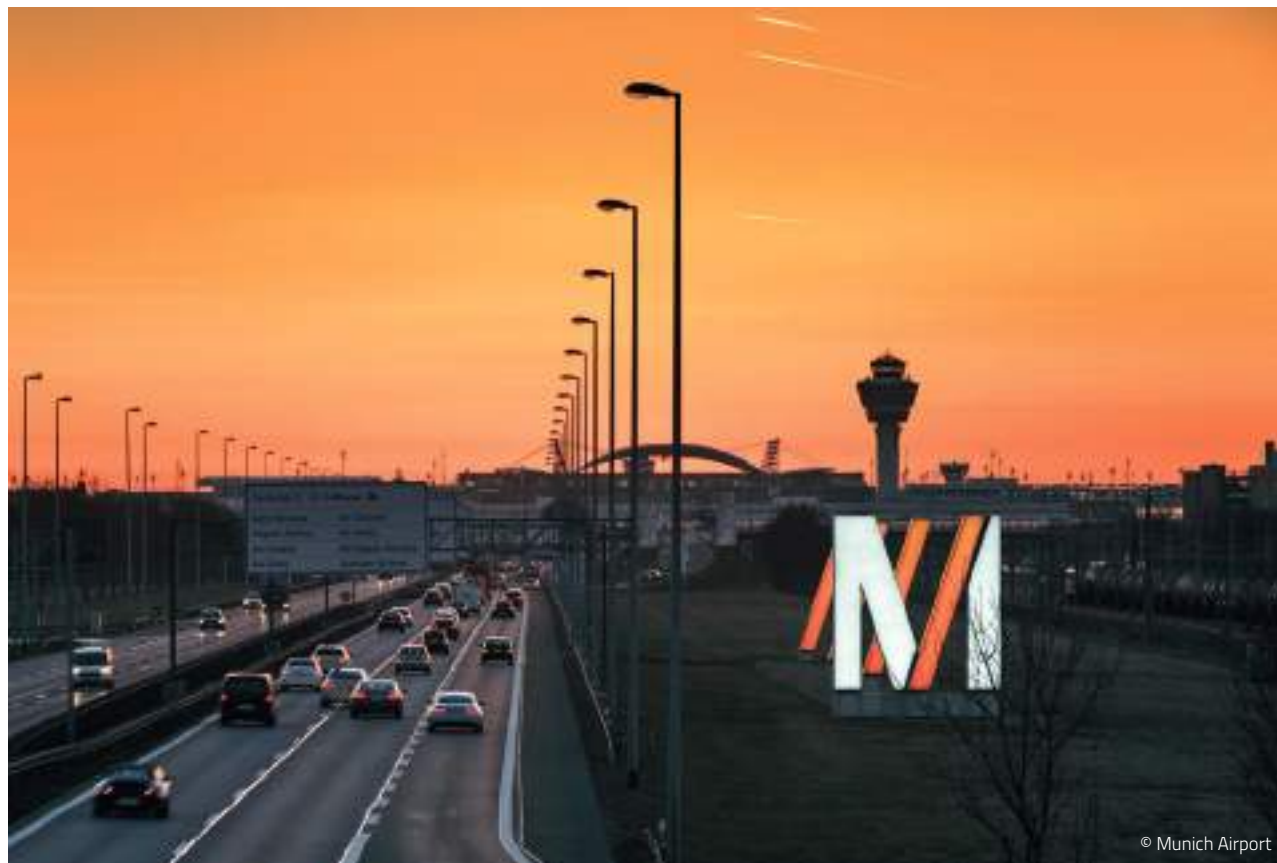
All accredited teams, the ECA family and officials who book accommodation through the Munich 2022 LOC and adhere to the booking deadlines will be provided with transportation.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

All accredited teams, the ECA family and officials who book accommodation through the Munich 2022 LOC and adhere to the booking deadlines will be provided with transfers from and to Munich Airport (MUC) or Munich Main Station.

You will be provided with a link to our EMS to enter your arrival and departure details, including special travel needs like paddles, wheelchairs, and bulky luggage. The arrivals and departures portal will open in Q1/2022, travel details deadline is 08 August 2022.

Munich Airport Franz-Josef Strauss is located 26 kilometres (25-minute drive) and Munich Main Station is located 22 kilometres (40-minute drive) away from the Olympic Regatta Centre.



SHUTTLES BETWEEN THE HOTELS AND THE OLYMPIC REGATTA CENTRE

All accredited teams, the ECA family and officials who book accommodation through the Munich 2022 LOC and adhere to the booking deadlines will be provided with transfers between the official hotels and the Olympic Regatta Centre.

The shuttle buses will run during all official training and competition days, no individual transport requests necessary.

Please note that para-athletes with wheelchairs require special transport and therefore must register their shuttle needs at least 24 hours in advance. The exact registration procedure will be communicated at a later stage.

VISA INFORMATION

ACCREDITATION

Munich 2022 will operate an accreditation system across all sports and all venues for the European Championships. All participants need to be accredited to enter the canoe venue. Registration for accreditation through the EMS is mandatory for all teams, officials, and the ECA family. The accreditation portal will open in Q1/2022, the accreditation deadline is 15 June 2022. The LOC will provide registration links to the teams and ECA.

Please note that photographs will be required during the accreditation process.

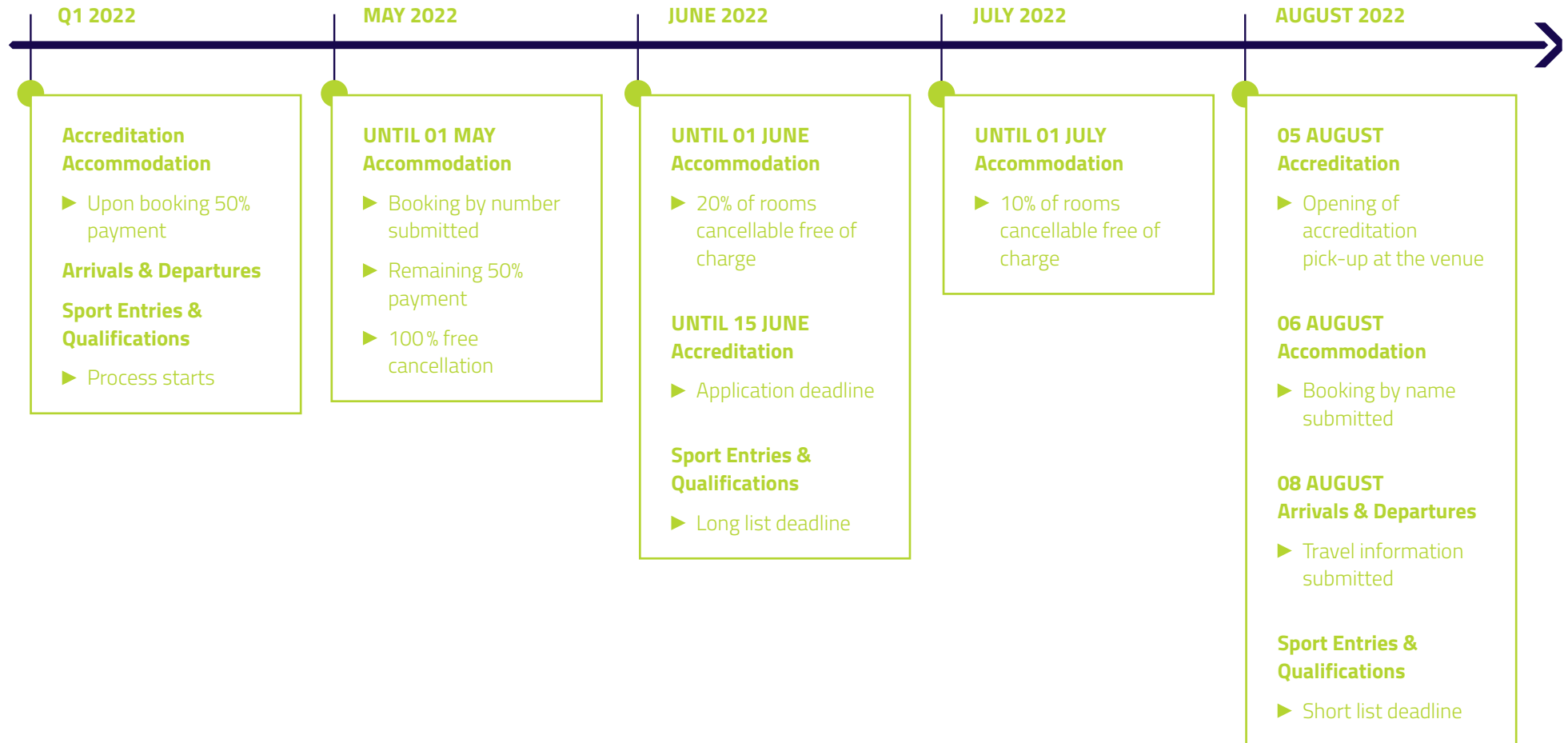
The Munich 2022 Main Accreditation Centre will be located at Olympiapark. We will also offer a Venue Accreditation Centre which is located directly at the Olympic Regatta Centre, and open for pickup during venue operations times (opening from 05 August 2022).

Team Leaders are requested to book an appointment to collect the accreditation for their entire team delegation. Vehicle Access and Parking Permits (VAPP) will be provided for a limited number of team vehicles in a dedicated team parking area. Team vehicles with boat trailers will be allowed to enter the venue and unload the boats.

MEDIA AT THE REGATTA VENUE

The Venue Media Centre (VMC) will be located behind the Grandstand East and will operate from 17 August through to 21 August 2022.

On competition days the VMC will open two hours before the start of the competition and close three hours after competition. Tabled and un-tabled media tribune seats will also be available on a first come, first served basis.

MEDIA ACCREDITATION

All media accreditations must be requested via Munich 2022. Links for registration will be provided and communicated by the Local Organising Committee and ECA with the media portal and accreditation expected to

open in March 2022 (exact date to be confirmed). The accreditation deadline for media is 30 June 2022. Media accreditation can be picked up at the Main Accreditation Centre, located at Olympiapark, from 08 August 2022 with further information to be made available in due course.

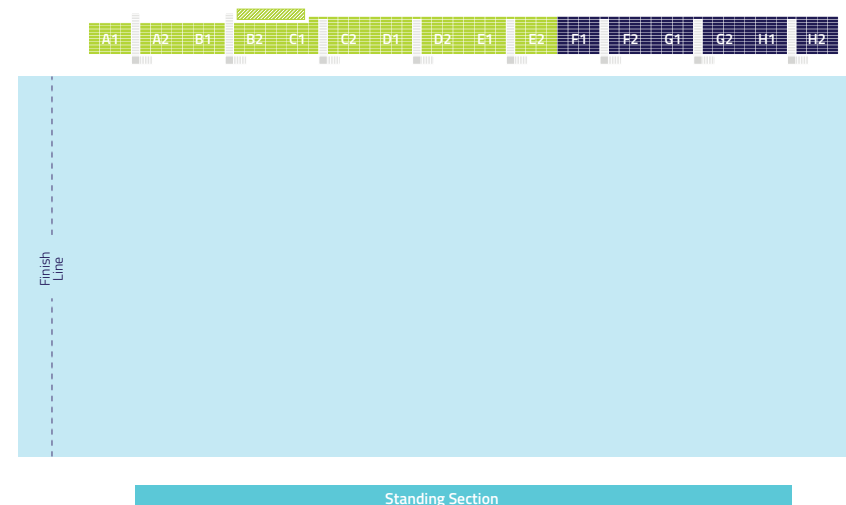
