3 LOCATION

Lee Valley White Water Centre is part of the Lee Valley Regional Park which stretches 26 miles along the leafy banks of the River Lee. The Lee Valley runs through London, Essex and Hertfordshire and includes London 2012 venues, heritage sites and over 10,000 acres of parkland. Just 40 minutes from the centre of London, Lee Valley White Water Centre is not only one of the best Canoe Slalom venues in the world but perfectly located for visitors to enjoy the capital city.

3.1 Location of airports, rail network and roads to the venue/city

By Air

London is one of the world's best-connected cities. With 5 international airports serving over 300 destinations, high-speed rail links to continental Europe and an extensive public transport network, London can effectively accommodate all participant and spectator needs no matter how they choose to get here.



There are 5 international airports located in and around London (distances from LVWWC):

- London Stansted 40 km (25 miles) 35 mins
- London Heathrow 66 km (41 miles) 45 mins
- London City 37 km (23 miles) 40 mins
- London Luton 50 km (31 miles) 40 mins
- London Gatwick 99 km (61 miles) 70 mins

The official airports for the Championships are London Heathrow and London Stansted.

By Boat

Ferry Terminals & Channel Tunnel (distances from LVWWC):

- Channel Tunnel Folkestone 137 km (85 miles) 95 mins
- Dover Ferry Terminal 148 km (92 miles) 105 mins
- Ramsgate Ferry Terminal 139 km (87 miles) 105 mins

- Harwich Ferry Terminal 115 km (72 miles) 90 mins
- Portsmouth Ferry Terminal 166 km (103 miles) 115 mins

By Rail

Eurostar operates frequent daily high-speed services connecting Paris and Brussels to London taking around 2 hours. Trains arrive at St Pancras International station in central London.

LVWWC is well connected to central London with direct trains to Waltham Cross from London Liverpool Street, London Stratford and Tottenham Hale stations.

- Waltham Cross 1 km (1 mile) 2 mins (or 15-20 min walk) Mainline Service to London Liverpool Street Station
- Loughton 10 km (7 miles) 13 mins London Underground, Central Line to London Liverpool Street Station
- Tottenham Hale 14.5km (9 miles) 20 mins London Underground, Victoria Line to Kings Cross/St Pancras Station.

By Bus

Local Bus Services - numerous local bus services 212, 213, 240, 250 and 251 all stop at the entrance to the LVWWC providing easy access to the surrounding area.

- Knebworth House 43.2 km (26.8 miles) 34 mins
- Cambridge University 74.8 km (46.5 miles) 55 mins.

In addition Central London is within easy reach with its world class tourist and cultural attractions, including Museums, Theatres, Oxford Street, the London Eye and the Tower of London.

4 VENUE

4.1 Description of competition venue and sport infrastructure

The Lee Valley White Water Centre was the venue for the Canoe Slalom competition during the London 2012 Olympic Games. Located 30km north of the Olympic Park, within the 26-mile long, 10,000 acre Lee Valley Regional Park in Hertfordshire.




LVWWC is arguably one of the best courses in the world and an important Olympic legacy venue for ICF Canoe Slalom.

The venue consists of two canoe slalom courses:

- 300m Olympic course
- 160m legacy loop
- and a 10,000m2 lake

The centre is a hive of activity for canoeing and kayaking for the local community and visitors, with suitability for beginners to elite athletes. The venue also serves as a major leisure attraction for White Water Rafting. Owned and funded by Lee Valley Regional Park Authority and managed by GLL the centre offers an extensive sports development programme and is also home to the British Canoeing Slalom Performance Programme.

4.3 Presentation of the technical aspects of the course

The LVWWC was purpose built and designed in close collaboration with the IOC and ICF to host the Canoe Slalom events for the London 2012 Olympic Games and has been developed and the facilities extend since that time.

Both courses are independently pump-fed from the lake which is filled from an aquifer, guaranteeing clean white water at all times.

The Olympic Course – Grade IV rapids

- 300m long white water course, with a
- 5.5m descent from the start pool to the finish pool
- 5 pumps delivering/pumping up to 15m³/s

The Legacy Loop – Grade III rapids

- 160m long white water course, with a
- 1.6m descent from the start pool to the finish pool
- 3 pumps delivering/pumping up to 10.5m³/s

The Lake

- Total water 9000m3 filled from aquifer
- Depth 1.8 (1.2m when both courses are running).

6 ENTRIES & PARTICIPATION FEE

6.1 Entry process & deadlines

Entries and accreditation requests must be made by the National Federation using the ICF's online entries system (SDP): https://icf.msl.es/icf/icf.jsp

Numerical Entries

- Numerical entries close: 5 August 2023
- You must submit through SDP the number of athletes you will enter into each event.
- Please also give indicative numbers for the overall number of athletes and team personnel who will attend the event with your delegation.

Nominal Entries

- Nominal entries close: 9 September 2023
- Each athlete competing must be entered by name.
- Team personnel must also be submitted for accreditation at this time. These entries will be used to produce the accreditation cards for all teams.

Entries or accreditation requests sent directly to the committee or the event organiser will NOT be accepted.

6.2 Participation Fee

A Participation Fee of GBP £120 will be charged for each accredited athlete and team official, to cover the duration of the Official Training and Competition phases of the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships.

7 TRAINING

7.1 Pre Event Training Periods

Training Period 1 - Monday 22 to Friday 26 May 2023

Training Period 2 - Wednesday 6 to Sunday 10 September 2023

1 training slot per day per athlete will be guaranteed during these training periods. For the May week the HOC will provide two slots per day for slalom paddlers if capacity permits. Please note in order to facilitate this there will be no, or minimal, kayak cross training opportunity during the May training week.

To register for training during these periods please use the ICF SDP system. The deadline to register for the pre-event training periods is 4 weeks prior to the respective training weeks:

- May training week registration deadline 24 April 2023
- September training week registration deadline 9 August 2023

Please note that in order to provide equitable training opportunities, the ICF does not permit teams to book additional training sessions with the venue during these weeks.

Please note there is no access to the water for teams to train on Monday 11 September 2023.

7.2 Official Training

Official Training takes place from Tuesday 12 to Monday 18 September 2023.

1 training slot per day and per athlete for slalom plus 1 training slot per day per athlete for kayak cross.

7.3 Unofficial Training

8 ATHLETE SERVICES

8.1 Athlete facilities at the venue

The following facilities will be provided for all accredited athletes and team personnel during the official training and Competition phases:

Additional toilets, changing rooms and showers are provided in the main centre.

Catering outlets onsite will provide nutritional options for purchase to cater for athletes and team personnel.

8.2 Athlete services at the venue

The following services will be provided to all accredited athletes and team personnel during the official training and competition phases:

Video Service - Siwidata will provide TVS signal into the team tents. There will also be a TV located in the Athlete Lounge to allow teams to watch the competition.

Internet Access - Wi-Fi internet throughout the Athletes Village and LVWWC site.

Drinking Water – Access to drinking water for all accredited athletes. We encourage the use of reusable water bottles and discourage the use of single-use plastic bottles.

Refreshments - Quality outlets will be available throughout the training and competition period for athletes to purchase food and drink. In addition fresh fruit and snacks are provided in the Athlete Lounge.

Boat Repair – space will be provided for teams to undertake boat repairs.

10 TRANSPORT

11 VISA REQUIREMENTS

A UK 'Standard Visitor' Visa will be required for athletes, officials and support personnel from countries which the UK Border Agency has categorised as 'Visa Nationals'.

Individuals should apply as early as possible. Applications can be made up to three months in advance of the proposed date of travel. To find out how long getting a visa might take in the country you are applying from visit www.gov.uk/visa-processing-times. (*Please note if a nation does not apply for their visas in due time, it cannot be guaranteed that their application will be processed in time and that additional charges may be applied by the UK Government for an express service*).
