The 2025 European Canoe Polo Championships will take place from 8.09.2025 - 14.09.2025 in the <u>Stade Nautique de l'Ecoparc, Tirepied, FRANCE</u>.

A total of four performance categories will take part: men, women, U21 men and U21 women.

2.1 Insurance and medical care

The event is covered by third party insurance in case of damage to third parties at the venue. All hospital services provided in our public health services must be paid directly by the athlete or by the national federation he/she represents.

Medical assistance at the venue will be provided for first aid and is included in the daily fee. Urgent or more complicated cases will be taken to hospital. Transport will be provided by the organizer. The medical center will be in the competition area and a relay in the athlete area.

An osteopathic school will be available in the athlete village.

2.2 Anti-doping control

The doping controls that will take place during the event will be carried out scrupulously according to the established and strict guidelines of the International Canoe Federation (ICF) and in cooperation with the national authorities AFLD.

To ensure that doping controls can be carried out efficiently and effectively, a dedicated room has been reserved at the venue.

2.3 Security

Police will be around the site to ensure the safety of all participants. Volunteers will check the entries in the accredited area and to ensure that only authorized athletes can enter the athletes' area. All athletes must wear their ID cards and show them at the entrance of the venue to prove that they are participating in the Games.

These security measures will be ensured by the local security authorities.

No campsite at the venue!

3 Catering

The organization committee offer 2 catering solutions: for teams and for visitors.

For teams: lunch and dinner in a dedicated area near the athlete village every day from the 8st to the 14st of September.

11:00 – 14:00 ⇒ Lunch

18:00 - 20:30 ⇒ Dinner

The menu will be presented at the beginning of the week. Different meals will be offer: raw vegetables, conventional dishes with fish or meat, veggie, pork-free... Go with side dishes: starchy food and vegetable. Desserts and fruits.

For the visitors food trucks and a refreshment area organize by the local club for lunch from Tuesday to Sunday.

















6.2 Scrutineering

ECA Canoe Polo Scrutineering Guide for European championships

12.3.1 - Trademarks, advertising symbols and words must be identical and in the same position on the kayaks and clothing of all players.

12.3.2 - Any kayak, accessory, or article of sportswear, which does not comply with the conditions will be ineligible for use during a competition. National federations are responsible for ensuring their own equipment meets these rules and regulations.

1. Cosmetic Checks

At the commencement of scrutineering, each team will present their equipment for checking. The whole team will have a visual check to ensure a high quality uniform appearance of helmets, PFD's and kayaks. Each failed item MAY be subject to a 50€ fine (as determined by the event organisers). This fine must be paid before rechecking will occur before progressing to Step 2.

For multiple cosmetic test failures the whole team will lose their scrutineering time slot and will return for rechecking at a later time. Rechecking will take place after all other teams have had their initial checks. Practice times will not be rescheduled.

2. Safety Checks

All kayaks, paddles and helmets will be subject to safety checks for sharp edges. These checks have NOT changed and any failures will need to be rectified.

PFD's will be subject to padding thickness checks. Pfd's will also be checked for number dimensions.

Each player will initially be required to <u>wear</u> his or her Helmet (with facemask). These will be checked also for helmet number size .

The bumpers of EVERY kayak will be checked for condition- they must correctly attached in new or near new condition and of the correct dimensions. Any failures will be required to be replaced. Glue or silicone on the bumper that is still wet will result in a fail. Equipment will be sent away from the scrutineer area and must be returned later for a check.

All paddles will be checked for edge thickness, corner radius (30mm) and sharp edges. Any failures will need to be rectified as these specifications have NOT changed.

Any issues identified on any piece of equipment will be clearly noted on the team check sheet and initialled by the scrutineer. This issue must be rectified prior to the equipment moving onto the next stage.

3. Technical Checks

Note: due to wear and tear-Bumpers are a safety check not a technical check.

Any kayak with an ICF label may be selected for a random check with full gauges for the technical specifications.

Any kayak with an ICF label failing the technical specifications will be banned from use and the manufacturer will be asked to explain-Note: severe penalties apply.

Any kayak without an ICF label is not allowed to be used during the European championships.

13.14.2 - On the kayak front deck, the area above the kayak seams and extending 35cm from the front of the cockpit is reserved for

a boat sticker incorporating ECA logo, Event logo, Event sponsor logo with the option also of country code for teams.

There is an area reserved for NF sticker.

















Step 1 - Cosmetic Checks

This step will ensure all items of equipment are uniform in colour and decals for each team.

Kayak checks will ensure any vinyl covering is of a high quality, with limited wrinkles and creases and will last the duration of the event. If vinyl covering is used it must uniform in colour and texture for the whole team.

Cosmetic Check FAIL- Vinyl covering must be smooth and done with care to match the whole team.

Ensure a good professional look that lasts the whole event. 50€ fine would apply per kayak







Cosmetic Check FAIL- 2 kayaks with significant red showing and kayaks with different logo's or decals above join line- 5 * 50€ fine would apply





















Kayaks must be uniform in colour and logos above the edge.

Cosmetic Check FAIL- The clear carbon boat looks different in colour * 50€ fine would apply





Cosmetic Check FAIL- 3 kayaks with different decals above join line- 3 * 50€ fine would apply



Cosmetic Check PASS- All kayaks, PFD's and helmets the same

BUMPERS

All kayaks of the same team should have the same colour bumpers, black is the preferred colour.



Cosmetic Check FAIL- Kayak with blue bumper 50€ fine would apply





















HELMETS

Must be of a uniform solid base colour- the practice of covering a helmet with strips or sections of vinyl or tape is no longer acceptable. Several teams have asked about clear gel and the types of weave, also if they are allowed to have a mix of clear gel and colour gel.

Helmet numbers must be the minimum size of 75mm high and be a clearly contrasting colour and font size to stand out from a distance. Helmet numbers must be cut from one piece of vinyl. Strips of tape or vinyl to create numbers is no longer acceptable.

The following is acceptable:





Note the white Kevlar and white gel, from a distance they look the same – this interpretation will be applied at the World Championships.



The black helmets above are a mixture of weave and one black gel, this is acceptable once viewed from a distance and will pass.

The manufacturers logo does not need to be covered as long as it is similar in size to the ones below.











All stickers and logos must be identical in size, colour and location. Previous events scrutineering stickers must be removed.



Cosmetic Check FAILdifferent logo's on each helmet 50 € fine per helmet.





















PFD

Body protection must be uniform in colour and appearance. Minimum number size Front 100mm and back 200mm.



Cosmetic Check FAIL- numbers the wrong size. 50€ fine would apply per PFD

Some manufacturers have been inconsistent when creating different sets of PFD's for National Teams. The 'band' at the bottom has been produced in different colours:



This is hidden in the normal paddling position, as seen in the second picture, therefore **will not** result in equipment failure during scrutineering.

TEAM COLOUR (Personal equipment)

If an athlete chooses to wear a bib-style deck it must be worn under the rash vest and not on top, as it would not align with the team uniform.

The rash vest ("Team Lycra shirt") must always be worn as the first layer directly under the PFD.
























Step 2 - Safety Checks

This step will check all equipment for points of safety.

KAYAKS

Will be tested for sharp edges, rough surfaces and padding attachment.

Kayak padding must be in new or near new condition and in one homogenous piece firmly attached to the kayak with no lose edges or ends as per the specifications. No tape, wrapping, extra foam or other substances may be used to increase the padding profile or to ensure correct attachment!



Kayak padding (Bumpers) must be uniform (the same) colour for all members of the team.

Any padding failing Step 2 must be replaced with a new padding of the appropriate type to suit the kayak design before it will pass. It is recommended that teams or individuals carry spare sets of padding for each design (Minor repairs can be completed during the event with tape or wrapping)





















PADDLES

Must have no sharp edges or lose tape. Edge thickness will be tested using the appropriate gauge. Edging materials such as Kevlar tape must be correctly attached with no loose edges.

Electrical tape or equivalent is no longer acceptable to make paddles thicker or to cover sharp edges as it is too easily removed or comes off.

If the paddle edge is damaged a more permanent solution such as Kevlar edging is required.











When using the gauge if a paddle is able to enter the slot and reaches the bottom, this will be classed as a fail.

"Players may not apply any greasy substances to their equipment that change the frictional coefficient of the original surface."







Wax will only be allowed on the paddle shaft, in an area that would be covered by the athlete's hand when paddling normally. Epoxy repairs are still allowed.





















HELMETS

Must have a correctly fitting facemask that covers from the jawline to the temple.

** Note ** A gap of less than 5mm between the top of the faceguard and the helmet will be allowed. The 5mm can be measured using the paddle gauge.



Fail - does not cover chin




Fail - does not cover chin





Fail – occipital bone not covered.





Red area: Helmet

Blue area: Facemask

Minimum coverage – note chin

The faceguard needs to be fitted so that a paddle cannot enter the gap between the face and faceguard when the head is tilted back.





















HELMET BOLTS

Must not stick out too far or be dangerous (rusty, Bolt sticking out of nut and so on).









BODY PROTECTION (PFD)

All disciplines within the ICF are now required to have a rule which specifies the type of PFD that is allowed during competition, The rule for polo was updated as:

"16.10.1 - The body protection in the form of a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) must meet or exceed the current ISO 12402-5:2020 and carry the appropriate label."

In Europe this means:

PFD/BA falls into Category 3 PPE (Personal Protective Equipment), third party testing is required

before notification to the recognised body in each country. Finally, a 'Certificate of conformity' is issued at which point the equipment can be sold within the EU.

The PFD will carry a label similar to this:



In the form of a PFD must have the required thickness of 20mm on the front, back and sides.

(Please note- this is a NEW specification to improve player safety. PFD's that previously passed scrutineering may not meet this increased specification.)



PERSONAL JEWELRY

As per rule 3.3.4 "a player must not wear any items (such as jewellery) that can endanger either the wearer or any other player".





















Step 3 - Technical Checks

This step will check the technical aspects of all equipment in particular the kayaks.

Kayaks will be checked for the following:

- ICF Canoe Polo Kayak Manufacturing Label fixed inside kayak. Any kayak must have an ICF label permanently fixed on the inside surface in front of the seat. These kayaks will receive the following checks:
 - o Random gauge checks of all main dimensions- Length, Width, Depth and Weight
 - o Random gauge checks of all main radii and/or height/depth/width

Any kayak failing any technical specifications will fail scrutineering and will not be able to be used in the event.





























Appendix 2 Scrutineering






Paddles, Helmets, PFD's

Each kayak gets a scrutineering sheet attached to the seat to track progress

Stage 2 - Once cosmetic checks are passed all kayaks and equipment proceed to safety checks (volunteers to help transfer items to new area)



Stage 3 - Technical Checks, Kayaks checked for ICF Label, dimension and gauge tests

Dimension tests including length, width, depth, radii

Dimension tests including length, width, depth, radii

Once technical checks are complete, kayaks and equipment returned to team representative. Kayaks failing technical specifications will not pass <u>scrutineering</u> and cannot be used.

All players from a team need to attend scrutineering, as helmets and PFD's will be checked whilst being worn by the individual.























7 Clarification Rules7.1 Sprint start


Not at the Same Time:

If one player arrives late and fails to maintain control of their kayak, resulting in direct contact with the nose of their kayak on the opponent's body, PFD, or helmet, the action will be considered deliberate and/or dangerous.

- · The referee shall call an Illegal Kayak Tackle,
- A sanction card will be awarded,
- The color of the card will be determined based on the severity and impact of the contact.

If a player chooses to dive in front of an opponent's kayak to gain possession of the ball, and as a result is hit by the opponent's kayak, this will not be considered as a dangerous tackle by the opponent because they did not cause the dangerous kayak tackle.

If one player is clearly first to the ball, the other player (who does not get the ball) must make the effort to avoid any dangerous kayak tackle or contact with the opponent's body.



If both players arrive at exactly the same time and there is incidental contact, such as one kayak sliding over the other without significant impact, it will be considered normal play.

- No foul will be called,
- No card will be issued, as the contact is not deliberate, as both players are contesting the ball fairly.



7.2 Defender's paddle

If a defender is stationary with their hand(s) or paddle positioned beyond arm's reach, and an attacker deliberately initiates contact by moving into that area:

- No foul will be called, provided that,
- The defender's hand(s) or paddle remain stationary,
- It is the attacker's responsibility to avoid contact in such situations when attempting to shoot or score a goal.

























7.3 Illegal hand tackle

Before the Throwing Action begins:

If the attacker's arm is stationary and the throwing action has not yet started,

The defender may play the ball, provided that:

- There is no forceful or downward action,
- The contact is not dangerous, and
- The defender makes contact only with the ball, not the hand or arm.



Once the Throwing Action begins:

As soon as the ball is raised behind the attacker's head, indicating the start of the throwing motion:


 No contact is permitted with the attacker's throwing arm or the ball.

10.21.2.d - Any hand-tackle from the side or from behind, that either strikes or pulls back the throwing arm of a player who is in the process of throwing or passing the ball.

The participating fifteen nations send teams to the various game categories. This results in the grouping and scheduling of matches.








































